




What is this open house about?

In 2016, the City of Enderby is undertaking an infrastructure renewal project for Cliff Avenue between Highway 97 and the Shuswap River. Enderby residents have been invited to familiarize themselves with the design and to ask City staff and the consultant team questions about the project.

PROJECT PHASING






Why is this project happening?

Cliff Avenue's infrastructure is ageing. The watermains running under the street are nearing the end of service life, and the roadway has inadequate storm drainage. The road structure and sidewalks are in poor to very poor condition.

Replacement of the watermains and the addition of storm sewer infrastructure requires the removal and replacement of the Cliff Avenue roadway, sidewalks, and street trees.

To minimize disruption to residents and Cliff Avenue businesses, the project will be done in two phases. The first phase, from Highway 97 to Vernon Street, will occur this spring and be completed before the summer high season. The second phase will begin after the summer high season and will be completed by the end of 2016.
