GATEWAY LIGHT COLUMNS

Distinctive light columns welcome visitors at either end of Cliff Avenue. Reminiscent of river pilings and towering trees, these perforated weathering-steel structures are lit from the interior to create light patterns across the pavement. The columns are a prominent feature at Highway 97, where there are currently few visual cues to mark the entry to downtown Enderby.

PEDESTRIAN SAFETY

To help achieve Enderby's goal of attracting residents and tourists alike to an appealing and economically successful main street, a focus has been placed on pedestrian safety and comfort. Widened sidewalks and new street trees enhance walkability, and curb extensions at crossings increase pedestrian visibility at intersections. A continuous sidewalk connection to Belvidere Park, combined with the gateway feature at Railway Street, make a comfortable and inviting connection between the river and the downtown.

STREET TREES

A combination of columnar and broad-canopy street trees will create a continuous canopy on Cliff Avenue. In combination with widened sidewalks and new seating, these trees will create a comfortable pedestrian environment for decades to come. Continuous soil trenches beneath the sidewalks will maintain tree health, prevent pavement cracking and heaving, and encourage a long-lived and beautiful urban forest.

RIVER PAVING

The Shuswap River greatly influences Enderby's character, from forestry and transportation to river floating and leisure activities. Continuous sidewalk 'river' bands run the length of Cliff Avenue in hard-wearing and cost-effective concrete and exposed aggregate, marking the main street as a special place.
