**DELEGATION**

Chris Coers – School District No. 83

Re: Update on potential school closures

- School District is evaluating facilities to find cost savings.
- Enrollment of 8,500 10 years ago; now only 5,900.
- High costs with declining enrollment.
- Town Hall meeting:
  - Closing of Grindrod School would be premature as our population is growing.
  - Once a school is closed, it does not get re-opened.
  - Need to look at reconfiguring schools to avoid Grindrod closure. This could involve a transportation review to find efficiencies.
- No decisions have been made as yet. There is a public board meeting scheduled for February 9<sup>th</sup> to start decision-making process.

In response to queries from Council:

Is a 4 day week being considered? Ms. Coers supports exploring this to save money and keep Grindrod school open.

Ms. Coers closed by stating that it will be necessary to think proactively about our facilities so that the decisions that are made now make sense 5 years from now.
