<u>Chris Henderson – Rossworn Henderson LLP, Chartered Accountants</u> Re: Auditor's Report 2015 Financial Statements

Mr. Henderson reviewed the items that stand out in the statements including:

- Revenue more monies spent from grants.
- Expenditures \$1.2M worth of depreciation that does not reflect cash flow.
- Financial assets are down due to spending.
- Capital assets have been invested and have increased more than the depreciation.

Overall, the City has done a good job of investing to deal with tangible capital assets. The Chief Financial Officer did a very good job.

Shirley Fowler – Communities in Bloom

Re: Information about CiB

Ms. Fowler provided a brief background of her involvement with Communities in Bloom. She explained how the program works. Once registered, judges will visit and evaluate based on 6 criteria. A report is generated that provides excellent feedback.

A coordinator would be required to organize volunteers. With recent works being done around town, Enderby is prime to get re-involved with CiB.

It was suggested that Enderby consider starting with the Novice Program where 3 categories would be selected. The judges would then evaluate and consult in going forward with 3 more categories.

In response to questions from Council, Ms. Fowler indicated that she would be pleased to participate in our Volunteer Fair on April 2nd. The Assistant Corporate Officer and Planning Assistant will work with Ms. Fowler to establish a booth at the fair. It is anticipated that Councillor Schreiner will work with Ms. Fowler at the Fair.

RECOMMENDATION

THAT Council receives and files this memorandum.

BACKGROUND

At Council's regular meeting on February 1, 2016, it adopted the Vacant Commercial and Industrial Buildings Inspection Policy. This Policy was designed to provide guidance to Staff on safety and compliance inspections of vacant commercial and industrial buildings. The first round of inspections was conducted on two commercial premises within the downtown core on March 30, 2016.

At the first premises, the building owners failed to make available a representative to allow access by the inspectors. The owners have been advised that the premises will be re-inspected in two weeks. The total fees associated with this inspection were \$1100.

At the second premises, which is presently undergoing some interior construction, the owner was given thirty (30) days to obtain a building permit for the works that were presently occurring. As the premises was otherwise generally compliant, the next vacant building inspection will occur in 60 days. The total fees associated with this inspection were \$550.

Hi Tate,

This e-mail is a follow up to our conversation last week regarding the potential for a transfer station near nearer to Enderby. I've just written down a few of the things that came to mind when we spoke.

This is the first I have heard of this idea. It has not been a topic of discussion in the time I have worked in Solid Waste Management at the RDNO (since 2007).

The RDNO currently operates transfer stations in Cherryville, Kingfisher and Silver Star. Cherryville and Kingfisher are both located significant distances from the nearest RDNO Recycling and Disposal Facility (CTS ~ 40 km from Lumby RDF; KTS ~ 60 km from Armstrong/Spallumcheen RDF). Revenue collected at these facilities does not cover the annual operating costs and is subsidized by revenue from the larger sites. The SSTS function was established to provide service to residents and businesses at Silver Star Mountain. The SSTS function is funded entirely by the benefitting properties and is not subsidized in any manner. The service areas for these transfer stations are not served by curbside garbage collection and have no other solid waste disposal options other than the transfer stations. There are many things I believe Enderby Council should consider before advocating for such a facility. The first three that I thing would require some discussion are;

- 1. Service Level Expectations
 - How many days/week would they expect the facility to be open?
 Cherryville TS is open 2 days/week, Kingfisher TS is open 2 days/week for 6 months and 1 day/week for 6 months
 - What range of services would they expect to be provided at the facility?
 The CTS and KTS accept a wide range of products other than just refuse; these products include wood waste, yard & garden waste, tires, refrigerated appliances, scrap metal, blue bag recyclables etc.
 The SSTS accepts only refuse and blue bag recyclables (i.e. what would be place curbside in an urban collection area)
 - A one or two day/week facility really wouldn't increase accessibility and wouldn't address concerns about convenience and the amount of illegal dumping
 - The more days a site is open, the higher the costs
- 2. Location
 - Depending on the desired level of service, the size of parcel required is large than you think
 - Roll off truck need to turn around, room for customer vehicles is required etc.
 - Solid Waste Management facilities are generally not welcomed to the neighbourhood with open arms
- 3. Revenue Collection/Capital Costs/Operating Costs
 - Would the facility be scaled or would it operate like the CTS and KTS where the TS Attendant collects fees based on estimated volume
 - How would the facility by funded, as part of RDNO Solid Waste Management (likely subsidized by the larger sites) or like the SSTS function by the benefitting properties?
 - Would the large municipalities support subsidizing another rural facility?
 - The capital costs, depending on the level of service provided, could be significant.

It's not just a case of setting out a couple of 40 yard roll off bins for people to throw their stuff. There is a lot more involved to do it properly.

Dear Kevin:

The Enderby Television Syndicate no longer has a reason to exist as the three stations we have been rebroadcasting (CHBC - Kelowna (Global), CTV - Vancouver and the Knowledge Network are no longer being broadcast nor will they be. As a result we are disbanding and our only remaining asset is our Bank of Montreal account which contains \$6,205.47. I am attaching a bank draft for that amount which can be used by the Fire Department for SCBA equipment.

Just a bit of history regarding the Enderby Television Syndicate. It was started about 1955 to rebroadcast CHBC and was the first TV service in Enderby and surrounding district. The money was raised by the community as was the amount required to get the CTV equipment up and running. The Knowledge Network was set up by funding from the provincial government. In the past years the City of Enderby and NORD have given annual grants and that is where the above amount comes from.

I have managed the Syndicate since about 1965 with the help of a board of directors. The directors at this time are Colin Matejka and Greg Halvorson. Dan Lutz was also a director but recently passed way. I would also like to thank Kim Francis for her help with annual reports and accounting. The road to the upper site (Knowledge Network) was built by Audrey Baird of Baird Brothers at no cost to the Syndicate.
