The Wonderful World of Salmon ...

Kingfisher Interpretive Centre is outdoor discovery that will foster your sense of stewardship and respect for the environment, while providing a whole lot of family fun.

The centre, located 25 km east of Enderby along Mabel Lake Road on the bank of the Shuswap River, is the place to learn about the salmon lifecycle, fishing, the Shuswap River and local biodiversity. The community-run, cen-



tre is situated amongst 10 acres of a cedar-hemlock rainforest and is surrounded by riverside trails to explore.

For decades, the

salmon hatchery and living classroom has hosted thousands of school children teaching them about the importance of salmon, watershed protection and restoration while encouraging participation in various activities and events. Hatchery tours are available to everybody. Be sure to also visit the on location traditional First Nations' full-sized kekuli dwelling.

Every October during the Thanksgiving weekend, the centre hosts a salmon egg take. The public is encouraged to participate in the fun that will see the collection of salmon milt and eggs to produce some of next year's salmon.

River Exploration and Adventure ...



The Shuswap River, flowing west from Mabel to Mara Lake, and running through the centre of Enderby, is a pristine feature of the area not to be missed, especially on a hot summer day. The beautiful and inviting waters beckon those who enjoy nature or adventure. The waters offer calmer sections for tube floating or paddling while thrill seekers will enjoy the challenge of the Skookumchuk Rapids. Swimming and fishing opportunities are found all along the river, while water and nature lovers will spot dozens of bird

species including eagles, blue herons and swans. The beautiful, white sandy beach, picnic area and playground at Tuey Park (Waterwheel) entice all to enjoy the fresh, clear waters while sipping a cold drink under the shade of a tree. Tuey Park can be accessed by water or land.





Most popular tubing route

It's recommended to start with the slower and shortest tubing route.

Belvidere Park to Tuey Park (Waterwheel) will provide about an hour and a half float time. If that's too long, you can disembark at the boat launch north of the Riverside RV Park. Life jackets are required, and floating times will vary depending on the time of year and type of watercraft used. River access points provide easy entry and exit, and offer restrooms, garbage cans and parking.

River Ambassadors...

During the summer months, Shuswap River Ambassadors are present along the river, at boat launches and in parks to provide information on how the river can be used and enjoyed safely and responsibly. River safety and environmental stewardship are also part of the ambassadors' mandate as the waters are ecologically and culturally important to the area.


Ashton Creek

As you make your way along Mabel Lake Road following the Shuswap River east of Enderby, you'll come upon the rural community of Ashton Creek. The farming area offers a variety of services at Ashton Creek General Store, and the community hall on the bank of the river provides a gathering place and hand launch.



Kingfisher/Mabel Lake

Making your way further east along Mabel Lake Road, you'll find yourself at Kingfisher/Mabel Lake. The area is home to the Kingfisher Interpretive Centre salmon hatchery, a community hall, trails, the Mabel Lake Golf Course, Mabel Lake Farms, famous for their delicious blueberries, and two marinas and two stores to serve permanent and seasonal residents.



Grindrod

Driving north of Enderby along Enderby-Grindrod Road will land you in the small community of Grindrod, located beside the Shuswap River. Stopping for lunch at the popular Riverfront Pub, you'll enjoy great food and music. The local store, community hall and Grindrod Park will entice you to stay the afternoon. The park is equipped with a newly built hall and playground, as well as public washrooms, river access and a walking trail.



Mara

Traveling along Hwy. 97A brings you to Mara. As you enter the community, you'll find Mara Foodliner on the highway

which provides gas, groceries and fresh produce. The farming community also has a hall, community park and church. The Shuswap River is once again the natural backdrop, while camping and recreation can be enjoyed at Mara Provincial Park. Reservations are recommended.

Grandview Bench

Turning off Hwy. 97A at Grindrod, you'll travel along Grandview Bench Road where you'll discover stunning views of the farmland and river below. The Larch Hills Ski Area provides cross country skiing in the winter, and trail traversing in the spring and summer. Residents enjoy regular gatherings at the Grandview Bench Community Hall.

Inviting Parks...

Barnes Park

As you enter the city of Enderby, you'll be greeted by one of the area's family-friendly parks. Barnes Park offers large grassy areas for picnics and sports, a playground, skateboard park, basketball court and outdoor heated pool. A new green gym, installed this March, is the first in the park's upgrades to come. There is also a covered area and gazebo featuring local artifacts from the Enderby & District Museum, public washrooms and ample parking. The park also plays host to many of the city's Canada Day festivities.

Belvidere Park

Downtown Enderby is home to the inviting Belvidere Park situated along the Shuswap River. The city and area's Chamber of Commerce and Visitors' Centre is located in the park. You'll find easy access to hand launch a kayak or tube to make your way down the river, and the Riverwalk paved trail is an easy riverside stroll featuring a viewing platform. The park hosts several activities such as free outdoor concerts and fairs. Public washrooms are located in the Vistiors' Centre at the park, and there is plenty of parking.

Tuey Park/Waterwheel Park

The beach awaits you at Tuey Park. This riverside park has a large, white sandy beach with shallow water and sandbars, a playground and plenty of grassy area, parking and a restroom facility. Dogs on leaches are welcome.



Riverside Park

Riverside Park is the place to play ball, boasting several ball diamonds, a large covered gazebo, washrooms, playground and close access to a boat launch, swimming and the Riverwalk. The adjacent Riverside RV Park offers treed sites for RVs and tents, showers, outdoor summer kitchen, barbecue pit and washrooms.

Mara Provincial Park

This beautiful park located on Mara Lake has something for everybody including a boat launch, large swimming area, washrooms and many picnic sites.


Grindrod Park

Fishing for Fun!

Fishing is something you can do year round in Enderby and area. Spring, chinook, kokanee and sockeye salmon abound as the fish make their way back to their spawning grounds on the Shuswap River east of Enderby. Cooke Creek campground on Mabel Lake Road is an ideal casting spot during the salmon season. Summer, spring and ice fishing for rainbow trout and whitefish are popular at Gardom and Hidden Lakes.

Licenses are required, and can be purchased at Grant's Tackle Box, 1304 George Street (Hwy. 97A) or Ashton Creek General Store 895 Mabel Lake Road. Consult the BC Freshwater Fishing Regulations Guide for information on regulations and restrictions.

Nature at its Best

Enderby and its surrounding areas are abundant with natural habitats, making it home to many animals, large and small, and vegetation of varying species. Here you'll find several sensitive grassland and wetland species, some not found anywhere else in Canada. A mule or white-tail deer may cross your path, while beavers and otters busy themselves in the shallow waters. Bears, coyotes and even moose and cougars are not unusual to spot. Songbirds fill the air with their sounds as they make their home along waterways, in meadows and lush forests. Osprey can be found along hydro power lines, while eagles build their nests high above the Shuswap River. Colourful vegetation such as cow vetch, common chicory, foxglove, clover, wild strawberry and heather are abundant while the forests are filled with pine, spruce, birch, cedar, aspen and cottonwood.



Bird Species

Keep your eyes open and binoculars at hand to catch a look at any number of amazing birds including Canada geese, hummingbirds, pheasants, quails, , kestrels, flickers, ravens, pileated woodpeckers, Stellar's jays, blue herons, eagles, hawks, cranes, swans and many others.



pristine Lakes, Refreshing Fun...

An abundance of lakes in the area await quiet days of fishing, swimming, birdwatching or canoeing.

Mara Lake

The white sandy beaches and blue water of Mara Lake will entice. This provincial park features a boat launch, and resort accommodations. Ideal for swimming, boating, waterskiing and camping, Mara Lake is a true gem with the community of Mara close by should you need groceries or supplies. There are also Bed and Breakfast accommodations near the lake.

Trekking the Trails ...

The breathless views and scenic discoveries you'll find while traversing Enderby and area's trails and treks will leave you feeling uplifted and rejuvenated.

Enderby Cliffs

A must do in Enderby, the Enderby Cliffs trail is close at hand within the city and will provide unforgettable, panoramic views of city, valley, mountains and waters below. This 2,246 class A provincial park boasts a hiking-only trail, leading through lush wilderness, volcanic rock and fossil sites. Solid footwear and plenty of water is a must, particularly in the summer months.



Enderby Cliffs parking and trail access at the end of Brash-Allen Road Open: April-October Hiking time: 1.5 - 3 hrs up and 1.5 - 3 hrs. down Difficulty: Strenuous with steep sections

For a less strenuous stroll, enjoy the Jim Watt Heritage Riverwalk that follows the meandering Shuswap River through town. Enjoy reading about the river and area's history along the way at the many posted signs. Benches follow the path to provide resting and viewing stops. Hunters Range, Larch Hills, Gardom Lake, Hidden Lake, Kingfisher Trails and Mt. Mara Lookout also offer treks of varying abilities. Touring by wheels

If taking in the scenery by motorcycle or vehicle is more your speed, Enderby and area has plenty of routes. Those in cars or motorcycles will enjoy the Shuswap River Route, Mabel Lake Road to Kingfisher, Mount Ida Circuit or a complete circle tour of the Shuswap. Mountain bikers will have a blast on the trails at Mabel Lake and Larch Hills which boast scenic views and forested areas. Recreation Abounds ...

Enderby has got your recreation covered. From softball, fitness classes, aqua fit, curling, golfing, skating, hockey and so much more, Enderby has something active for everyone to enjoy.

Summer Outdoor Fun

The Enderby Lions Pool will likely be your first stop on a hot, summer day. The pool in Barnes Park at the entrance of town is open mid-May to the end of August. Not only is there public swimming and various aqua classes and special events offered, but the pool can also be rented for parties. The kids' playground and skateboard park in Barnes Park is close at hand as is the new green gym.

Ball diamonds at Riverside Park are available to reserve for tournaments, while pick-up games can be played at Putula Park, Kingfisher Hall and Riverside Hall.

Take a swing at the area's golf courses including Son Seekers, Birchdale and Mabel Lake. The greens await you to enjoy a quick nine holes or another round before you head into the club house at Mabel Lake for a refreshing drink and delicious lunch. A cool dip in Mabel Lake after a round or two of golf will bring a hot summer day to a finish.

Recreation Services



Enderby's arena and curling rink provide family fun with their many public skating times and drop in curling. You can also watch curling from the lounge overlooking the ice sheets, or catch a minor hockey or shinny game at the arena.

Bundling up to head outside is a popular pastime in Enderby and area when the snow starts to fly. Cross-country skiing and snowshoeing are among the popular activities. Larch Hills north west of Enderby boasts over 100 km of nontrack-set trails and over 50 km of track-set trails. Snowshoe enthusiasts or beginners will delight in trekking through the trees at Kingfisher Interpretive Centre.

Downhill skiing, snowboarding, skating, tubing, snowshoeing or snowmobiling at nearby Silver Star Mountain Resort in Venron may also entice you.

The Snow Awaits ...

Hunters Range

High in the hills above Enderby you'll find Hunters Range, an ideal mountain recreation destination. The over 90 km of groomed trails will keep you exploring all day. The alpine meadows and amazing vistas will take your breath away. Hiking, biking, quadding, snow shoeing, horseback riding and snowmobiling are all enjoyed at the 200 km area of Hunters Range.

The Hunters Range Snowmobile Association maintains the groomed trails and several chalets where sledders can warm up. The 300 member group hosts several events throughout the season including the Bingo Rally in January and ladies' ride in March. splatsin Tradition

The Splatsin people of the Secwepemc Nation have occupied their traditional territory in the Shuswap region for thousands of years. Here, you will find deep roots, lasting tradition along with forward thinking vision. Splatsin is the Yucwmenlucwu (caretaker of the land) on behalf of the Secwepemc Nation which stretches from Mica Creek in the north to the Columbia River to the US border, and Monte Lake in the west. Splatsin has three reserves including Salmon River, Enderby and Sicamous. Splatsin honours the Secwepemc culture through practicing the language and enjoying numerous cultural events including celebrations around the importance of the Shuswap River.

Splatsin's 1,000 on and off reserve population are governed by an elected chief and councillors who serve two-year terms.

Building for Tomorrow


Splatsin is building and planning for the future, and nurturing the younger generation plays a vital role in that. The community offers schooling, daycare with extensive programs, a health care centre and a taxing authority.

As part of that future vision, Splatsin opened a new community centre in the fall of 2015. The massive, unique, traditional structure located on Old Vernon Road is visible from Hwy. 97A. The building features a living roof, traditional pictographs, an arbour/fire pit area and an interior design honouring Splatsin elders. The facility boasts a full kitchen, indoor track, change and shower facilities, gymnasium, meetings rooms and much more.

A new boardroom and administrative offices were also recently constructed on Hwy. 97A. The building features a full convenience store, Tim Hortons restaurant, art gallery and gas station. The traditional carvings on the massive timbers depict a rich history.

The Splatsin Development Corporation oversees and is partnered with successful businesses, municipalities and forest companies. Some of these include a forest management company, the service station, Quilakwa RV Park, a construction and environmental services company and the Monashee Community Forest.

The city of Enderby and Splatsin continue to successfully work together and build bridges as the two share a common vision of growth and prosperity for the two communities and region.

Various distance and time.


