PORTFOLIO REPORTS

Councillor Baird

Attended the City Clean up. Noted that wood from the planters in the parking lots to the north of City Hall is falling into the parking lots. Discussed opportunities to improve the area.

Councillor Baird and Chief Administrative Officer agreed to meet on site to discuss potential options.

Councillor Baird noted that the pergolas in the breezeway have paint flaking and need to be refresh.

Chief Administrative Officer noted that he has given direction to Public Works to assess their capability and capacity to sand and paint the pergolas in the breezeway.

Councillor Baird had a great first meeting with the Event Coordinator. Planning for Canada Day is under way and they will be having weekly meetings on Tuesday mornings.

Will be attending a Rail Trail Governance Advisory Committee meeting on May 6.

Will be attending a Library Board Meeting next Wednesday.

Reported that the grad drive-through breakfast was a huge success and that the grad parade and prom will go ahead this year on Friday May 13th with photos following.

Councillor Baird asked about having an AED placed at the ball diamonds.

Chief Administrative Officer responded that a safe location for storage would need to be identified because of concerns of vandalism, and suggested that the ball user group storage building may be suitable.

Councillor Baird asked if this is something that should be discussed with Area F as Riverside Park falls to the Commission. The Chief Administrative Officer said that it would be. Councillor Baird advised that she would forward the information to the Chief Administrative Officer about the proposed AED.

Councillor Shishido

The Enderby and District Arts Council has received a \$16 000.00 resilience grant and may be putting on performing arts shows during the Friday morning markets on Cliff Avenue.

The Enderby and District Arts Council is also considering putting on a mini arts festival and is looking at potentially painting fish on the storm drains. Also considering building a fence on the vacant lot beside the arts centre to display art.

Councillor Case

Attended the City Clean up which was a great success.

Councillor Davyduke

Attended an interagency meeting on April 27.

Community Futures is planning to resume spending one day per week in the office at City Hall, and has reported that there was a great response from businesses during the Business Walk.

Councillor Davyduke reported that there are many jobs posted on the board at WorkBC and that some businesses are accessing the wage subsidy program.

Reported that Feed Enderby & District distributed 120 hampers in April and will be starting a coupon program for the Enderby Farmers Market in June.

Attended the Enterprise Challenge at the Performing Arts Centre in Vernon.

Met with members of Tkwapla7 from Splatsin with Councillor Schreiner and discussed potential agenda items for a Community-to-Community meeting.

Attended the Business Walk.
