Pre-Authorized Payment Plan Changes

We have changed up our pre-authorized payment plan program to make it more convenient for you.

NEW: Auto-Renewal for 2027 & Beyond

After you enroll for the pre-payment plan for 2026, your plan will auto-renew annually going forward with a monthly payment amount that either remains static, or is calculated based on the previous year's taxes, depending on the program for which you sign up. If you were enrolled in the Plan for 2025 property taxes, you still need to renew your application for 2026.

NEW: Pre-Authorized Payment Plan for Utilities

You can now sign up to have the balance of your utility account automatically withdrawn from your account on each utility due date.

The form to enroll in the program is available on the City website or can be picked up at City Hall.

Home Owner Grant Applications

It's that time of year again! Make sure you claim your Home Owner Grant if you are eligible. Home Owners must apply to the Province for their Home Owner Grant every year. Claim your Home Owner Grant by visiting:

Any grants claimed after July 2nd are subject to a 10% penalty.

Water Restrictions During Reservoir #1 Reconstruction

As of May 1, 2025, all properties connected to the City of Enderby drinking water system must follow **Stage 2** water restrictions.

Stage 2 water restrictions are required due to the reconstruction of Reservoir #1, which has reduced water storage capacity in the system.

The graphic to the right summarizes uses allowed during Stage 2 water restrictions.

Following an extraordinary event, such as a structure fire or water break that causes a sudden and significant water loss, the need to replenish water storage to normal levels may require additional temporary, emergency water conservation measures over and above the Stage 2 restrictions.

Construction is expected to be completed in September 2025.
